## Rehearsal Notes 03/12/18

#### Away in a manger p61

Bar 12 – basses be gentle on the upper notes where you have your quavers

#### O come, all ye faithful p226

Altos and Tenors – sing the small notes in the refrain each time on the words "O come, let us adore him"

#### God rest you merry, gentlemen p83

Tenors & Basses – last bar on the top line, sing your words on the 3<sup>rd</sup> beat of the bar

## A merry Christmas p164

Sopranos AND Altos sing the opening phrase

## Angels' Carol – sheet

Bar 31 - basses watch your octave interval on the word "De-o"

Bars 78 and 94 – basses make a bright sound on your top D in both these bars

Bars 96 and 98 - tenors and basses watch the placing of "Glo-ri-a"

Bar  $97 - 2^{nd}$  sopranos you are in unison with the  $1^{st}$  sopranos on the word "De-o" at the end of the bar

Bars 102-103 – all watch for the rall

Bar 104 to the end – sopranos make sure you have enough breath to support your final phrase

## A New Year carol p122

In verse 3, bottom stave, make the word "the" sound like "thee" in the phrase "open you thee East Door"

## Sussex carol p242

Bars 41-42 (p244) – basses watch your interval from the bottom D to top C on the words "angels and men"

Bar 48 – S/S/A need a bright sound on the Ah's

# Snow Song (sheet)

Bar 26 – sopranos and altos change the word "the" to "that" (they hear that music loud)

Bar  $31 - 1^{st}$  tenors you should have a rest on the fourth beat of the bar. Your entry is the second beat in bar 32.  $2^{nd}$  tenors sing on the fourth beat of bar 31. The same thing applies for bars 69-70

Bar  $65 - 2^{nd}$  sopranos sing the same as the 1sts (F# quaver to A dotted crotchet)

Bars 65-66 – tenors put a tie from your last note in bar 65 to the first note in bar 66 (on the word "Grove")

Bar  $68 - 2^{nd}$  sopranos sing an F# crotchet on the fourth beat (not two quavers which are notes for the 1<sup>st</sup> sopranos)

# The Twelve Days After Christmas (sheet)

Letter F / Bar 53 – split on the top stave is S/S/A. 2<sup>nd</sup> sopranos sing where there are middle notes, otherwise in unison with the 1<sup>st</sup> sopranos.

Letter H / Bar 71 – watch the change to a slower tempo

Bar 82 (2 bars before letter J) – the harmony split on the fourth beat of the bar is Tenor / Baritone / Bass

Bar 88 (5 bars after letter J) – the harmony split on the fourth beat of the bar is S/S/A
